Spin Cycle (2019), A photography exhibit showcased in the JMU's Forbes Center for the Performing Arts. This work was created in collaboration between photographer Addison Bryant and Virginia Repertory Dance Company members Lindsey McKim and Ana Hart.

Conquests in Fragility, an exhibition performance trio exploring the limitations of movement and the fragility of arthritic joints, displaying intricate glass, metallic, and fabric pieces created by B.F.A. Metals & Jewelry artist Kristen Woolard for her senior thesis.

Untitled (2018), a performance-based collaboration between JMU Theatre and Dance majors Gemma Dobbs, Seth Ranowsky, Hunter Carrico, Sophie Whitmer, Lindsey McKim, and Ana Hart that culminated in a final work based off of Amy Bloom's short story, *Psychoanalysis Changed My Life*.

look !, Trio, 2019. The internal dialogue of the desire to be seen and hold space; an exploration of body language and human interaction. Performed in Student Dance Concert.

The Meeting, Site Specific, Trio, 2019. A dramatization of a workplace meeting presented as “The Mindfulness Campaign.” Designed to mess with expectations. Compositional study.

feet on the ground, Group Work, 2019. An exploration into the constellation Pleiades, the dancers find community and curiosity in the movement. Performed in Student Dance Concert.

the separation, Solo, 2019. A representation of the figurative and physical separation that occurs due to realizations between adolescence, adulthood, and family. Compositional study.

Partial Blame, Trio, 2018. An intrapersonal investigation of guilt and how it feeds on an individual and one’s relationships. Compositional study.

Veza, Solo, 2018. A study into the ‘veza’ (or ‘bond’) with my mother and her experience as a refugee during the Yugoslav wars. Compositional study.
